# Wed 3<sup>rd</sup> October at the Firemans Arms, Petone

Presidents Meanderings, October edition.

It has been totally flat to the boards for the last month, which is pretty cool, but also pretty exhausting.

The Autocross at the end of last month went well, with Gerald as Clerk of Course for the day. I'm trying to spread our base of people who know how to run events, so that if I get hit by a bus, it's only inconvenient for me rather than the club as well!

I took a couple of hundred photo's during the day, experimenting with the newly unleashed "burst shot" on my camera, and managed to get some quite good sideways car shots during the day.

Dave brought his Rally car to the event, to a small round of applause, as he has entered the "Real Rally Drivers" club, by crashing his Charade precisely in the middle of the navigators door. Judging from the fact that Brian and Dave were still on good speaking terms, Brian obviously wasn't terribly phased by the indiscretion.

We had a couple of new competitors come along to the day, and hopefully we gave them enough encouragement such that they will return to us again to hurtle around the paddock.

Our guest speaker Graham was a huge hit, and we had the room packed to standing room only. He kept us amused with his tales of intercontinental adventure in a very overloaded, elderly Saab.

I was very impressed that he could get that much weight worth of spares and oil into a Saab without it immediately breaking in half, and also that he could get the car to move with all the luggage and stuff he was carrying with him, and a tiny two stroke motor. We then headed over to Stonehenge Aotearoa, for which I really did not know what to expect. There was the possibility of mad hippies dancing naked, which was slightly worrying to me. We then finished off the evening with a nice roast dinner, and a bus ride back over the hill being serenaded by Eric Clapton.

We have for you, a very cool event coming up on Labour weekend, that I think is a must do! We're doing our own local version of the ClubSport Nationals competition. Port Road is the first part of the competition, then on the Monday we are doing a Motorkhana and Autocross at the Todd Park "slightly sealed" venue.

HVMC is running Port Road, and the Monday events will be a combined effort from both clubs. We anticipate a good turnout for the Monday as well, so I would really appreciate some helpers for the day, if you aren't up to anything much on Labour Day Monday I'd love to see you there.

Now, for those of you who don't know, the ClubSport format is interesting because of the way they calculate results. When you enter the event, your "points" are scored according to how well you do in relation to the fastest ClubSport entrant. So, if you take twice as long to complete the course as them, they get 100 points (100%), while you would get 50 points.

The combined totals of all three results are added together to give the final result. This means that the really fast, bit horsepower cars pull out a lead from their Port Road results, but, the little cars then bring them back through being quicker through the Motorkhana courses, with the Autocross being about half way between the two.

This means that the quickest car doesn't always win, unless they get a good result in all three disciplines. Quite often the overall winner may in fact not be the winner in any one of the three events.

Obviously a few other people think it sounds pretty good too, as over a month out before the event, there are a dozen entries already.

Levin Car Club has asked me to pass along that we (Harbour Capital Car Club) are invited to their Christmas bash, which is (appropriately) going to be an Autocross held in the Afternoon of Saturday November 19<sup>th</sup>. So, in a small nutshell, lunchtime, no entry fee, no restriction on tires, just a low key skid in the paddock with a BBQ. Bring a plate of something yummy, and we can have a great afternoon.

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#### Rally New Zealand - A Great Experience

The Wellington pairing of Nathan Thomas and Richard Kelly are delighted to have finished their first Rally New Zealand. "It was an awesome experience and were happy we completed every stage", said Kelly at the end.

With the first two days of World Rally Championship round also counting for points in the Vantage Aluminium New Zealand Rally Championship there was more than just pride at stake.

However things didn't start well for the crew of the Wilford Motorsport Mitsubishi Evo VII. Getting loose on the very first stage of the rally they bellied the car just off the road.

"I have been training myself to start fast while others are still getting into the groove", said Thomas, "That's where I see I can make up time". Unfortunately the tactic didn't quite work this time with the loss of 28 minutes before they got going again.

This put the team at the back of the field despite posting some good top 10 times (in the NZRC field) in the afternoon. Then with the retirement of a number of other NZRC competitors on the tight slippery stages south of Pirongia, the team were pleased to have at least picked up 5 points.

The second day was a complete contrast. With faster roads in dry dusty conditions, Thomas took a more cautious approach. Getting faster as they went on, the team had an excellent day. Working their way up the NZRC field they finished comfortably in 9th. "It was a good day for us, no problems", said Thomas and the end.

Continuing on for the last day of the WRC event the team were looking to gain valuable experience as well as to enjoy themselves now that the serious part was over. With Nathan in his first serious attempt at the NZRC this year and Richard the only rookie co-driver in the

championship, the team readily took the opportunity for more competition miles.

Unfortunately the day didn't go all to plan when they lost second gear going into the famous Whaanga Coast stage. Despite this the Wilford Motorsport Evo VII continued on, all be it at a reduced pace.

"We wanted to finish and we did", said Thomas. "We're pleased to have finished every stage. It could have been better, but we're very happy to have the experience".

With only the Nelson Rally left to go in the NZ Rally Championship, the fight for fifth place overall has hotted up. The team's main rival Callum McInness failed to finish day two of Rally NZ and are now 3 points behind. Meaning that there is everything to play for on the final day of the championship.

"We're very happy with this weekend and our season so far", says team manager Nick Buck. "Especially considering that our budget is very small compared to others. We are the only team running on 98 octane pump fuel. To be fighting for a top 5 finish in the championship, in our first year, is excellent. Now we have to work out how to get to Nelson."


