### Rally Hawkes Bay – Aug 07

The Hawkes Bay rally this year was a round of the Round 4 of NZ Rally Championship along with Round 3 of Rally Extreme and Round 5 of the North Island Rally series so was well attended by all those competing in these series along with many others there for the fun of playing on the fabulous roads.



In difference to previous years the rally was run as a single day rally with originally 8 special stages but this was shortened to 7 in the weeks leading up the rally. First car off the line was a 6am so the front runners were all doing the first stage in the dawn light and us at the other end of the field were completing the final stage in the dusk.

I have to say was a relief to go back to a gravel surface after the last two rounds of the North Island series Waitomo and Taranaki being run on Tarmac. This is a very

unforgiving surface and the damage we saw along the way was much more extensive than what we mostly have seen on gravel surface rallies.

We were without the company of our Service man Dan Myers on this trip, although thankfully he had been able to do the necessary repair work after we damaged the wheel bearing in Taranaki, so we were grateful for the help of Brian Craig and my friend Margaret who came along to look after us for this trip.

Now being an NZRC there is a little more pomp and ceremony than the last 2 rallies so all the cars were on display on Friday night in the Sound shell on Napier's waterfront and was an amazing sight to see! We were able to catch up with some of the other club members competing over the weekend including Nathan Thomas and Richard Kelly who are sporting some new sign writing across the door sills advertising the car club which was fabulous to see. Sam and Nick Buck in Sam's Evo were parked not far from us, Vaughan Majendie and Mark Crawford, Len Fisher (co-driving for Tony Burrows this time) Cy Guest who was servicing for Tony. Fabulous to see so many club members!

Saturday dawned cold but clear so down to the Mitre 10 Mega car park for the official start. We were lucky as our report in time wasn't until 7:30am one of the benefits of being at the tail end of the field, mind you this was to cause a few challenges through the day. The first stage of the day was Waitara then into the Mohaka forest for the next two stages before heading to Wairoa Township for the Service Park.

One of the down sides of being 77<sup>th</sup> car on the road is that the big 4wd types churn up the gravel roads so we felt like we were sledging along at times, especially in the forest stages. These were tight and twisty and heaps of fun but fairly soft surface so the wheel tracks were quite deep, right up to the sump guard! We managed to loose one of the bolts that hold the front sump guard on but thankfully didn't let it slip forward as we would have been like a grader! Before arriving into Wairoa Township the organisers had set up a car wash in the local truck stop to lessen the amount of mud left in the service park. Seemed to work wonders as it made replacing the missing bolt a lot easier even it Brian did still end up with a bit of a mud pack.

Stages 4 & 5 were both pretty long stages at 34.4 & 21 kms before back to Wairoa and another wash by the fabulous team at the Truck stop. Stage 6 was a repeat of SS 3 in the Mohaka forest and we were hoping to have beaten our time from the first run but thanks to some pretty heavy rain most cars were about 20-30 seconds slower. The last stage was aptly named Darkies Spur as by the time we started dusk was definitely setting in. By the end of the stage I had to tip my notes up to catch the last of the light coming through the windscreen. We really must install the map light....

The last of the car washes by the local fire brigade before making our way back to Napier for the finish ramp. Prize giving was a big affair even if a few rude folk wouldn't stop chatting. The sponsors of the North Island Rally series have been very generous in the products that Brian and I have been recipients of so far. Brian is currently 2<sup>nd</sup> place in Class B Drivers and I am 1<sup>st</sup> Co-Driver in class B so a great result so far. Two rallies to go in the series with Daybreaker on Aug 25<sup>th</sup> and Rally of the North on Oct 13.

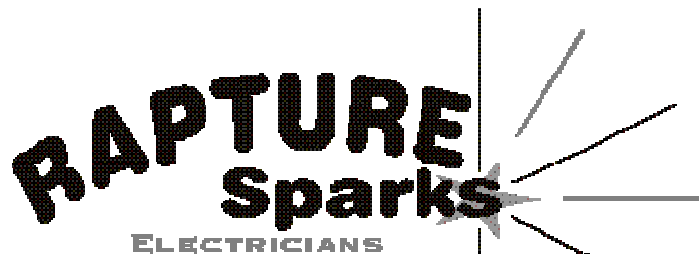
*Mike never forgot that elephant or the events of that day.*
