Further prattlings from the Pres.

We have, as usual, a madly busy year coming up for those of you who want to get out there and have some car club fun. It isn't just car related stuff either, as we've got a film night (well, actually, by the time you get this bulletin, we will have had a film night), bowling (of the ten pin variety), another mysterious bus trip by Gerald, possibly more DVD evenings at MotorSport House, and there's bound to be a go kart night lurking in there somewhere.

Levin car club is running a new sealed sprint this year, in March. It's in the vicinity of Kaihinau Road (Shannon way), Wellington Car Club is running Mt Vic on the last Sunday of April due to the council resealing the road in February.

Don't forget our Dual Car Sprint in April either. We're always on the look out for people to help us with the timing, even if you're not able to get your car ready in time. It's a good day out, and we try not to take it at all seriously up in the timing booth, so expect good natured heckling and merriment. Oh yeah, and we keep you pretty well fed and watered too.

This year, Levin Car Club is running every second Donnelly Park event, so the current calendar sees our club running all the odd numbered months (March, May, July, September etc), while Levin Club is going to run all the even numbered month events. So bear that in mind this year, when you're checking to see if an event up there has been rained off, as I might not be the man to ask every month.

Note that although we were hoping to run our sprint in April this year as a Multi Car, we haven't been able to, so it will run as the usual dual car sprint format all day. Please drivers, bring all the petrol and tyres you can get your hands on. If your car is up to it, you're going to be doing more laps than your brain can cope with. We might see how many people we can get out there doing ten runs or more during the day.

The Road and Track Sprint series is once again in action, and possibly featuring a trip to Taupo this year, which ought to shake up the results a bit. As per last year, the HCCC Sprint is the first of the series.

Unfortunately, it looks like HCCC might not be fielding as many entries to the Clubsports this year in Christchurch, as a submission to have the tyre regulations changed has been turned down. So we've got another year where Rally tyres are allowed to be used on the grass venues, and a lot of road tyres just can't be used full stop. A consortium of local clubs put an alternative set of regs together, to try to have Rally tyres banned from

the grass venue, and let people run any Schedule A compliant tyre on the sealed venues. We were not able to get these regs accepted, and after the problems encountered annually at the Nats reached their highest level last year, most of our local crew aren't willing to risk a wasted trip to Christchurch. This is a huge shame, as it is bad for Canterbury Car Club, it's bad for our club to break the tradition, and we Wellington clubs who put the alternative solution forward did feel that it could have been a good fix.

Anyway, I shall not go on about it, but the plan is to try to see that the regs are changed in 2009 so that more of us attend, and then when we attend, the tyre rules in place should achieve the intended design.

On to more positive things...

Our first autocross of the year in January at Levin was a fairly intimate affair, as we had a lot of the usual competitors running at the Triumph hillclimb scheduled on the same day.

We had a mere ten competitors, but had a lot of fun anyway. We set out a course with a bit of speed in it, and some exciting technical bits. The tightening corner over bumps, into a wet area of the paddock caught a few people including myself out.

Graham Heath showed a good turn of speed, and took out the overall victory for the day, followed by myself, Geoff Warren, and then Aaron in the white Corolla sedan.

Must be said, it's a pretty easy day with only ten competitors running! We were wrapped up, and out of the paddock by a quarter to one. We stopped en masse at the Otaki icecream and fruit shop just south of the Otaki bridge, and had a yarn, and a very large ice cream each.

Next on my radar was the Port Road Street Sprint, which has become one of my favourite events over the years. I decided two things for the sprint this year, that I was going to enter the MR2, and that I was going to go out with other people when possible.

I managed both, and it must be said, my deceased grandmother would have driven the MR2 faster than I did. I was afflicted with a lot more caution while driving the MR2 than I was while driving the Starlet last year. It showed, and I was two seconds slower in the supercharged 1600 than in the naturally aspirated 1300cc Starlet.

However, it was neat fun! The MR2 slides around nicely at the back while on road tyres, and gives a far better sensation of speed than the Starlet. I was keeping myself a long way from all the kerbs, and taking as few risks as possible (considering the usual red mist that descends with the installation of a crash helmet on one's head).

I got a bunch of passenger outings, which was great.

I went out with Nick Tollemache in the AE86, which was awesome. That guy drives with 100% pure commitment, and it shows in the results he gets. He was placing the car close to all the kerbs, and using every available inch of the road. When the car started to get away on him, he didn't lift off the gas, he merely let go of the steering wheel and kept on the throttle. This is great in theory, but I've never been brave enough to do that other than at an autocross event. Nick was doing that at 100kph while sliding towards solid objects. Great fun, I'd highly recommend it to anyone, as Nick really does drive the car like it is an extension of himself.

I also went out with Brian Craig, Pete Collins, and Graham Heath twice. Told you I was on a mission to go for heaps of passenger rides! Graham's car is pretty impressive, as with the super close gearbox, and very angry diff in it, the cars screams its head off, and the first three gears are stunningly close in ratio. Second to third it only seems to drop about 1000rpm, and keeps the engine on song like you wouldn't believe. Third corner was a bit exciting as there was some sideways, which lead to some over correction. This meant there was a certain amount of driving in the direction of a footpath at one stage.

Pete C's Corolla is definitely benefiting from the freshened engine, and really had a heap of grunt for a 4AGE. I can see that car being a lot faster during sprints now, glad I'm not in the 1600cc class, it looks like too much hard work!

Brian is on a mission to find some angry pills, so he can unleash fury on the world in his Corolla GT. I think he's being far too nice to the car, and that it really needs some more revs, and a bunch more angry © It's a good car, and I think he's going to have a lot of fun in it.

That's about it from me. See you all at the March Clubnight, which will also be our prizegiving evening

Saturday 5th April 2008 SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. PROMOTERS

The promoters of the competition are Harbour Capital Car Club Inc. (hccc.org.nz) All correspondence to be sent to : PO Box 4102 Wellington.

2. STATUS

The competition is a Clubsport Advanced Event held in accordance with the National Sporting Code of MotorSport New Zealand and these Supplementary Regulations. THIS EVENT IS A ROUND OF THE ROAD AND TRACK DUAL CAR SPRINT SERIES. The MSNZ permit number is TBA

3. VENUE

The venue for competition is the main circuit of the Manfeild Autocourse, Feilding. The circuit is sealed and approximately 3.03kms in length. All sprints will be run in a <u>Clockwise</u> direction.

5. ENTRIES

An **entry fee of \$90** MUST accompany the official entry form and be received by the secretary before 5pm on **Friday 28**th **March 2008**.

Late entries will be accepted until 6pm Thursday 3rd April 2008. Late entry fee is \$120.00

NOTE: This years entry fee has had to increase due to higher track hire and costs for the professional rescue crew who are there for your well being.

All entries must be on the official entry form, and accompanied by the entry fee.

Entry is limited to a maximum of 60 competitors ONLY.

No Single Seater Cars will be permitted to enter this event.

Should the number of entries exceed 60 the organizers will compile a Reserve Entry List. These entrants will be advised and will be required to attend Safety Audit & Documentation.

The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event if less than 35 entries are received by 28th March 2008.

Competitors who enter but withdraw before Friday 28th of March will receive a full refund. Withdrawals after this date, the club will retain 50% of the entry fee to cover fixed costs.

Please indicate on the entry form if you are prepared to take a helper / marshal for a ride.

6. DOCUMENTATION AND SAFETY AUDIT

Documentation and safety audits for Wellington based cars will be held on Thursday 3rd April 2008 at Vehicle Testing New Zealand (VTNZ) Porirua, 10 Titahi Bay Road between 6.00pm and 8.00pm.

Documentation and safety audits for out of town cars will be on the day at Manfeild, between 8.30am, and 9.30am. Cars arriving after 9.30am will not be accepted except at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

IF YOU CAN NOT BE AT SCRUTINEERING, YOU MUST ADVISE THE SECRETARY PRIOR TO 6pm THURSDAY 3RD APRIL 2008.

Safety Audits will be as per Appendix 2, Schedule A of the NZ Motorsport Manual Edition 34.

Vehicles fitted with an appropriate roll cage, seat belts and safety equipment as per Schedule A will be allowed to carry passengers.

Checks will be carried out on all vehicles with entries in their log books requiring them, as well as all cars without log books and any other at the scrutineers discretion, prior to the start of sprinting.

ALL DRIVERS MUST POSSESS AND PRODUCE FOR INSPECTION THE FOLLOWING:

- a) Current MotorSport New Zealand affiliated car club membership card.
- b) Current MotorSport New Zealand competition license. Minimum Clubsport status.
- c) Protective helmet and clothing, fire extinguisher as specified in the current MSNZ Manual.

7. DRIVERS BRIEFING

This will take place, on the dummy grid, at the entrance to the track at 9.45am. Attendance by all drivers is compulsory. A roll call of all drivers will be held.

8. SPRINTING

Sprinting will be from 10.00am and will be finished by 4.30pm.

Sprinting will consist of <u>up to 8 pairs of cars</u> on the circuit at any one time.

Sprints will consist of one standing and 2 flying laps. The three laps will be timed individually. The fastest recorded lap time will be used for the official results.

There will be no restriction on the number of sprints you do. All sprints will be timed.

All drivers and crew are to keep the sprinting to the track only, and speeding in the pits or off track testing around the streets of Feilding will not be tolerated.

9. PHOTOGRAPHER

Official photographer(s) will be present at the event and will be taking photos of competitors throughout the day. Please indicate on your entry form if you DO NOT wish the photographer(s) to contact you. There is no obligation to purchase any photos.

10. RESULTS

It is our intention throughout the day to post times on the notice board near the timing hut.

Official times and results will be made available at the after match gathering.

11. AFTER MATCH FUNCTION

The location of the after match will be notified on the day.

All competitors, crew and helpers are invited to attend.



Also you saw my (hysterical) historical photos from yesteryear, how about emailing me some of yours?


