Gravel Sprints

Over the last few months I have ticked off two more WMSA gravel sprints. Firstly there was Puketiro Road. A short 1.5kms of smooth but twisty road east of Gladstone in the Wairarapa. Last year I had been for rides with Graham Heath (Pulsar) and Roger Brader (RX3). So I thought I knew the road but was surprised in practise how much you don't note from the passengers seat. Light rain throughout the day meant changing conditions for the 32 entries. My times improved throughout the day but I know there is still some time to be made next year. Just to prove familiarity breeds contempt Ted Clay flipped his civic over at the left hander near the finish. The car suffered some front panel damage and Ted had a cold trip home with no windscreen. I was very happy to drive home with my car intact.

Next was Valley View behind Totara Park. This is a 3.8km piece of road used by trucks when logging the forest. The first 300m was seal before starting a steep climb to the top. Most of the road is clear of shade as the trees have gone which is vastly different to the last time I was there. We were very fortunate with the weather as the top of the road had 30mm of snow the day before. Another good field of 30 had practise and three runs (a few more for those with miss times). Practise was definitely used to look at the road which was in good condition except for a couple of heavily metalled corners. Jilly came with me for my first timed run so I was pleased to improve my time by 10 sec. Getting into my stride on my next run I attacked and took another 15 sec off. I just love the top section of this road. So I was looking for a good third run and it was until turning left at the top of the hill. There I hit sun strike 3-4 times having to button off just to stay on the road.



A good day was had by most. The main damage was to an Evo which went off after the finish line hitting a tree stump. Also Graeme Corlett tipped his starlet over at the bottom of the hill. There cars will both need to visit the panel doctor.

Well done Kapiti Car Club. Such a good venue so close to home. Great views of the south island from the top of the hill. Please run it again next year. I will be there.

Dual Car - Multi Car Sprints - A round of the Road & Track Series

Saturday September 20th at Manfeild Park

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

- 1. The competition is a Clubsport Advanced Event held in accordance with the National Sporting Code of Motorsport New Zealand and these Supplementary Regulations. The Dual Car Sprints are a round of the Road and Track Dual Car Sprint Series. Competitors must compete in at least three Dual Car sprints prior to competing in the Multi Car sprints.
- 2. Venue for competition is Manfeild Park, Fielding. The surface is Bitumen and is 3.03 km in length. Sprints will be run in a CLOCKWISE direction.

3. Officials: Organiser Bruce Dove

Clerk of Course TBA

Secretary Geoff Warren Chief Scrutineer Geoff Warren

Motorsport Steward TBA

4. Entries: The entry fee of \$90.00 must be sent in with the entry form and be received by the race secretary by 8pm Thursday 18th September. Entry is limited to 50 competitors.

No single seater car entries will be accepted or permitted to run in this event.

If entries exceed 50 a reserve list will be compiled. These entrants will be advised and required to attend Safety Audit and Documentation.

The organizers reserve the right to cancel / postpone the event if less than 30 entries are received / notified by 18th September 2008.

Late entries will be accepted on the day. Please notify the race secretary of your **Intention To Enter** by 18th Sept.

A \$50.00 late fee will apply.

On the day entries will be processed (documentation & scrutineering) once pre-entries have been completed.

Please indicate on your entry form if you are able to take marshals / helpers for a ride to show our appreciation for their help.

- 5. Documentation and Safety Audits will be held on Thurs 18th September at Total Performance, 21 Petone Ave. Petone between 6.00 pm and 8.00pm. Documentation and Safety Audits for out of town cars only will be completed at the venue between 8.30am and 9.30am. Cars arriving after 9.30am may be accepted at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.
- 6. Safety audits will be as per appendix 2, Schedule A of Motorsport NZ Manual Edition 34. Vehicles fitted with appropriate roll cage, seat, safety harness and safety equipment as per schedule A may carry passengers in the Dual car sprints only. Audits will be carried

out on all vehicles with entries in their log books requiring them, cars without log books and any other vehicle at the scrutineers discretion prior to the start of sprinting.

- 7. All drivers must present the following for inspection:
 - a) Current Motorsport NZ affiliated car club membership card
 - b) Current Motorsport NZ competition license minimum Clubsport status
 - c) Protective helmet and clothing, fire extinguisher as per current motorsport manual.
- 8. Drivers Briefing will take place on the dummy grid at 9.45am. Attendance by all drivers is compulsory. A roll call will be held.
- 9. Dual car sprinting will start at 10.00am. Up to 6 pairs of cars will be on the circuit at any one time. Sprints will consist of one standing and two flying laps, each lap timed individually. The fastest individual lap time recorded from the first three Dual car sprints will be used for calculating placings for the R/T series.

 Multi car sprints will start at the completion of three rounds of Dual Car sprints and finish at 4.30pm. Each grid will consist of 6 cars starting from a standing start and completing two flying laps, each lap timed individually. The fastest recorded lap time will be used for the official results.

All drivers and crew are to keep sprinting / testing to the track only. Off track testing around the streets of Fielding, speeding in the pit areas or other behavior liable to discredit the sport will not be tolerated.

- 10. The following classes will apply for Dual Car Sprinting in accordance with the Road and Track series rules:
 - A 3 & 4 cyl. Under 2000cc non turbo
 - B 4 cyl. Turbo, rotaries, 5,6,8 cyl and diesels
 - C 6 cyl. Turbo, turbo rotaries, 4WD and above
- 11. Timekeepers will endeavour to post times throughout the day on the notice board by the dummy grid. Official results will be available shortly after the completion of sprinting.

All persons attending the event are asked to ensure their pit area is left clean and tidy with all rubbish put in the rubbish bins or removed from the venue.

Your co-operation will ensure an enjoyable competition for all. Thank you.
