I'm not sure which movie we will follow with next, but I'm quite sure we can manage to find something!

As a follow up to the Facebook group comment, currently on that group there are 21 people who have said that they will attend the next Photoworks Autocross challenge round on June 13th. That event has only been advertised there for a couple of days (at the time I write this article). It is another demonstration that the more we tell people about events and occasions the more people are inclined to attend.

That, and the fact that with our DVD nights, and the Autocross events we are offering a good fun event to attend. I suspect if we were advertising root canals without pain relief, then the attendance would be slightly down.

Round # 2 at Slipway was well attended with 37 enthusiasts braving the interesting weather conditions. While it was a touch damp down at the venue, the car park for doco and scrutineering was well and truly shrouded in clouds.

Webster brought along a very small but very evil bicycle, which a number of people fell off whilst attempting to pull wheelies on it. So that provided entertainment right from the start of scrutineering.

Apparently that the seat is slightly behind the rear axle line makes it just a fraction unstable.

So we had a few more front skidders in the top ten this time, probably as some of the quicker rear drive cars weren't in attendance on the day.

Carnage was mostly of the mechanical failure variety. Webster split an oil line, Neil Tapp killed a CV, Stephen "Tallguy" killed the power steering belt, and a couple of Honda's ended the day with some front spoiler damage.

Luckily there wasn't the panel damage that happened last time, although there were some really narrow misses.

I was absolutely stoked with the Pulsar, as I'd had new (to me) suspension fitted the Thursday before the event, only to discover that the rear sway bar mounts didn't line up any more. So I was in the interesting situation of running beastly hard suspension, no rear sway bar at all, brand new semi's on the front, and semi's on the back that are I believe around ten years old.

I wasn't sure if the lack or rear sway bar was going to result in my understeering into stuff, or if the massive mismatch in the tyres from front to rear would result in my spinning backwards into something. In the event it turned out that the car was actually quite well balanced, and while a little bit tail happy certainly not that hard to control.

The day started out with water on the ground, but progressively dried out though it did turn bastardly cold towards the end of the day.

Brendon got beaten home by Stacey again (you knew I was going to say that Brendon!), Georgia Bartosh hounded her dad all the way to the finish line in the Capri and ended up only a whisker behind him. Leela was at her first ever Slipway event, and was wearing the face of a person who had discovered something a lot of fun. Pretty sure we have a new addict there.

Our next event up there is June 13th, and I'm sure it will be well attended and a whole bunch of fun. The one after that (July 31) is a Saturday event starting in the afternoon, and running into the dark. So watch out for that one, it should be scary but fun.

My next motorsport adventure was heading over the Rimutaka's to watch Tea Creek gravel sprint.

Although the weather was by all accounts miserable in Wellington that day, I got precisely one drop of rain on the camera screen all day.

It's a great venue to take photos at, as there is a neat series of relatively tight corners only a minutes walk from the start line, and about twenty different angles and places to stand.

Round 3 - 14 July, Petone / Hutt Valley, organisers Bryan & Mari Atkins (Sunbeam Car Club).


Round 4 - 11 August, Titahi Bay / Porirua & environs, organisers Wayne Gair & Dianne McDonald (Harbour Capital Car Club).

I'm pleased to report that despite there being more hits than Elvis at the first round, the "extra enthusiasm featuring crunchy noises" factor was a bit less at Round # 2. However, Stephen "Tall Guy Racing" did still manage to slightly adjust the front bumper of the Falcon following his power steering belt exiting stage left. Luke and Matthias also did a small amount of body kit alterations on a tyre, while Neil Tapp stopping his FXGT approximately one spark plug gap away from the tyre wall (your OTHER left Neil). Geoff saved his attack on the scenery until after the finish line, and managed to knock the glass out of his wing mirror.

Results from the pointy end of the field were interesting, with Al(baru) pulling five seconds out on his last run of the day to bring his Sti (now featuring a bigger turbo!) home nearly one full second clear of the field. A remarkable drive, and once again Al is demonstrating that his series win last year was no co-incidence. 
Just returned from a trip to Ireland, they have a simple answer to aggressive drivers in their road signs:
