Going back a few years when we were sitting on 80 – 90 people, there was a really good chance that I'd recognise every name on the membership list, and all our folk at events.

These days I actually have to look at the results sheets sometimes to figure out if somebody is in the club or not. That said, it's such a good community of car clubs that we have here in Wellington that it is largely irrelevant who belongs to which club anyway.

The Photoworks Autocross Challenge (in association with Neil's Wheels) finished the year with another solid entry of 32 people. Interestingly whenever we get nice weather up at Slipway, it's always our lowest turnouts. Maybe everyone stays at home and does the gardens?

It was an awesome day, although I took extreme precautions to stop myself from getting too burnt. I was pretty much taking a bath in sunblock every couple of hours, was wearing lots of long and light clothing, a huge hat, sunnies, and I consumed around my own bodyweight in cold drinks during the day.

The last round of the year was a great battle as always. Once again Al(baru) continued his domination. PC was hot on his heels in the Corolla, followed by Sam Duncan (HVMC) and Webster both driving Sti coupe's as well.

Unfortunately I wasn't able to have a play, as the Corolla was still an interesting shape at the front, but it did mean I was able to take a lot of photos on the day.

We'll try to book accommodation in the same place, and close to the venue, to make it a more team and social event. When we did this at the Taranaki Clubsport Nationals it made it an even more fun weekend (as we had the HVMC team, and some Aucklanders there too).

I'm keen like a keen thing, so hopefully my Corolla race car is actually running by then, otherwise I'm going to have to enter my standard road car (currently a station wagon).

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Mason Wins Dorset Rd - Dixon Wins Gravelsprint Series Dorset Road Gravel Hillclimb - 12 December 2010

The Wairarapa Car Club held their final event of 2010 at Dorset Road Mauriceville on Sunday 12th December 2010. Dorset Rd is 2.4 km of uphill gravel , windy and narrow and cars require a roll cage to compete. The event was the final round of the WMSA Gravelsprint Series and 26 vehicles were entered with four of those drivers with a chance to win the championship -Graham Heath, Anthony Paroli, Tony Dixon and Murray O'Neil. The cars were divided into the usual classes - Class A 0-1300cc, Class B 1301-1600cc, Class C 1601-2000cc, Class D 0ver 2000cc, and Class E all 4WD vehicles. The day was fine and warm with enough wind to clear the dust from the road after each car passed. The field was divided into two parts with the first 12 cars sent up the road and then brought back down to allow the second group to have their run. There was to be three official runs and after a practice the event itself



was underway.

Firstly it should be mentioned that one of the drivers, Adam Bligh (Mitsubishi Lancer EVO 6), was using the event as a test day and he ran in each group which meant that he had double the number of runs of the other drivers. Therefore he was not included in the official results and will not be mentioned further in this report. However it should be noted that Adam was the fastest car up the hill on the day registering a best

time of 1.55.00 which also seems to be the quickest time anyone has recorded up Dorset Rd. The official drivers were led on Run 1 by former National championship driver Richard Mason (Subaru Impreza) in a very good starting run of 2.05.60, followed closely by Tony Dixon (Subaru Impreza) 2.06.60, with Vaughan Majendie (Mitsubishi Galant) third 2.10.60. Also pretty quick out of the box on Run 1 were Shane MacKay (Toyota Starlet Supercharged) 2.15.50, Murray O'Neil (Mitsubishi FTO)



2.16.30, Mark Kibble (Subaru Omega) 2.14.80, Matt Patterson (Mitsubishi Evo) 2.15.60 and Roger Brader (Mazda RX3) 2.16.90.

Run 2 saw Richard Mason drop below the magical 2 minute mark with a time of 1.58.10 to continue to lead the field. Tony Dixon was comfortably in second place in a time of 2.01.10 with third place still held by Vaughan Majendie in a time of 2.07.40. Fourth place was held by Shane MacKay in his very impressive Starlet to be followed by Matt Patterson, Mark Kibble and the RX3 of Roger Brader. Stu Andrews was

leading Class A in his Toyota Corolla followed very closely by the Starlets of Todd Brooks and Gregg Ordish. Kevin George (Toyota Levin AE86) was leading Class B from Rob Piper and Stu McLean who were also both driving AE86 Levin's. Current Gravelsprint champion Graham Heath (Nissan Pulsar)

was leading Class C by 4 seconds over Murray O'Neil. Class D was led by Shane MacKay and Roger Brader with Peter Langdon's Corolla V8 lying in third place.

The final run saw Richard Mason, in an extemely assured performance, decrease his time to 1.55.10 and win the event. Second was Tony Dixon, who dogged Richard's heals all day, with a time of 1.58.10 and third was Mark Kibble, who had a brilliant final run, (2.06.40) to inch past Vaughan Majendie's time of 2.07.40 (Vaughan was fourth.) The rest of



the Top 10 were - Shane MacKay (first two wheel drive car home) 5th, Roger Brader 6th, Matt Patterson 7th, Anthony Paroli 8th, Graham Heath 9th and Murray O'Neil 10th. In the classes it was Stu Andrews who took Class A from Todd Brooks with Gregg Ordish third, Class B was won by Kevin

George with Rob Piper second and Stu McLean third, Class C was won by Graham Heath with Murray O'Neil and Alex Baker (sharing the same FTO) second and third respectively, Class D was won by Shane MacKay with Roger Brader second and Anthony Paroli, getting it all together on the last run, third. Class E was won by the three podium drivers -Richard Mason, Tony Dixon and Mark Kibble.



The day was mainly pretty uneventful as far as incidents go - Todd Brooks had a half spin on the first corner on his second run, Gregg Ordish had a confrontation with the scenery on run 3 but was able to drive his car back down the hill, Elwyn Priday (Toyota Starlet) had mechanical issues on run 2 and had to be towed down the hill and Adam Bligh threw a belt on run 2 but that didn't stop him from creating a venue record on the next run! The WMSA Gravelsprint Championship was won by Tony Dixon with 138 points from Anthony Paroli 137 points with Graham Heath third 134 points. Murray O'Neil was fourth with 131 points - these were the only drivers in contention for the championship at the start of the day. Well done Wairarapa Car Club - another great event.




