More from John on this year's trial Series:

All we have to do is ensure that we have enough competitors. It's a very cheap evening's entertainment, and much better than watching television! Come along for one or two events if you can't do them all. Bring your friends and family, and encourage your clubmates to have a go. Under Motorsport NZ's rules, newcomers can compete in 2 of these events without joining a car club - and even after that, only the driver needs to belong.

The format for the series is similar to recent years - five rounds, on the second Wednesday evening of each month from May to September; documentation from 7pm, first car away at 7:30pm; entry fee \$15 per car for each round; running time is about 1 hour 30 minutes; relax over a tea or coffee afterwards.

As we have done in recent years, we will again publish class placings for each event. This enables competitors, particularly newcomers, to compare their results with others of similar experience/expertise. However, the series points towards the Honda Challenge Trophy will continue to be based on overall placings in each event, as has always been the case. Crews can nominate the class they want to be in, and the definitions below are guidelines only:

Novice	All members of the crew are competing in their first (approximately) 10 car
	trials
Intermediate	Crews not in classes A or C
Expert	At least one member of the crew has won a car trial in (approximately) the
	last 5 years

Car trialling is a tricky sport to get used to, so if you're new to the sport, please stick with it for a few events until you get the hang of it. You might find it useful to have an experienced person in your crew for your first couple of events to explain things as you go. Look at the maps and explanations at the finish, and please talk with the organisers or other competitors if anything doesn't make sense. If you don't already have them, you should get hold of the rules (the Trials Competition Booklet, which has a section of Helpful Hints at the back). Ordinarily I'd give you a link to it, but it seems to have gone missing from the re-vamped Motorsport NZ website! I'll send the link later, if I find where it is.

For those who aren't sure of the rules for the Honda Challenge Trophy Night Trials Series, here's a summary:

All participants earn points towards the trophy, but you have to be a member of an affliated car club to win it.

"All participants" includes competitors (drivers, navigators, timekeepers, passengers, etc) and officials (organisers, checkers, marshals, etc).

Points for each round are based on overall placings: 1st = 20, 2nd = 17, 3rd = 15, 4th = 13, 5th = 11, 6th = 10, 7th = 9, 8th = 8, 9th = 7, 10th = 6, 11th = 5, 12th = 4, all others finishing within time = 3, those finishing maximum late = 2, non-finishers = 1; organisers = 20, checkers = 12, manned checks & controls = 3.

Progress report on the Niscort (SR20DET in Mk1 Escort)

The Niscort job list has been breathing in and out, but I am inching towards completion.

(1) It persistently locks the N/S front wheel, and I am running short of ideas.

The pistons move freely in the calipers - there are 8 in total - ex RX7 S4.... The pads are wearing identically - I swopped left to right without making any difference. There is no contamination on the (new) vented discs - Capri 2.8i, and no fluid weeps. I would swop the calipers around but they are "handed".

I'm booked in at Tony's for caster and alignment checking on Monday to remove another unknown.

"Normal" escorts have no adjustment except toe-in, but mine has an aftermarket sway bar which can be shimmed to adjust caster from +0.5deg to -3 deg. It is said that these cars like plenty of negative caster to reduce the understeer, but the caster return becomes huge at big negative angles, so I will compromise at -1.5deg.

- (2) It has developed a consistent misfire on boost.. I suspect low fuel rail pressure, possibly due to partial blockage in the fuel outlet at the bottom of the tank... this has happened before and stuffed up the fuel pump. I need to modify the outlet elbow to increase the diameter and fit an extension pipe to avoid the slurry at the bottom of the tank being sucked up.
- (3) It also has a slight appetite for brake fluid which is a worry. After painstakingly checking all pipe fittings I finally found the source last night..... The master cyl is fitted directly on the firewall, and is very inaccessible due to all the extra pipes and stuff on that side of the engine.. to allow topping up of the fluid, I fitted a remote reservoir with a pipe to a brass fitting in the cap of the original reservoir. This cap was not intended to be fluid proof, in fact has to breathe in and out with the fluid level fluctuations. Despite careful application of fibre washers and araldite this weeps slightly. The clue to this was the fluid level would fall overnight with no movement of the brake pedal. I need to review the sealing on the cap.
- (4) The rear brakes would lock up despite the Willwood pressure limiter being screwed to minimise the rear brakes.... but wait you idiot, you are turning the knob the wrong way....... This is now fixed and nicely adjustable... more testing required

I had a nagging doubt on the suitability of the low diff ratio (Alfa Romeo 105) of 4.3. In my test runs I always seem to be changing up through the box. The rev counter will not yet talk to the computer so I am guessing at the revs. Google gave me the ratios in the Nissan box, so I worked out the theoretical speeds in the gears based on the tyre dimensions. Surprisingly the gearing came out very close to the MX5 - 2900rpm at 100kph in 5th. Looks like the 3.9 ratio in the MX5 is countered by the taller fifth gear and 225/50 X15 tyres on the Niscort. The Nissan peak power is quoted at 6000rpm so it'll spin a bit faster than that. I couldn't get to max revs in the MX5 at the track, so the Niscort (a road car!) should be fine.

I have fitted a quickshift to the Nissan box, bought off the net for a paltry price. Wow it's like an electric switch - I see lots of entirely unnecessary gear changes coming on.

So just gotta carry on "carrying on".

And that is why, from that day to this, all French Army officers wear brown trousers.


