Only a couple of events for me since I last wrote, both of them being HVMC events over Labour Weekend. Port Road street sprints, and the Trentham autocross on the Monday.

Port Road isn't an event that particularly wow's me, just because of the nature of the course. Straight lines and 90 degree turns aren't really the strong suit of a 80ish kw Corolla sedan, because she's not exactly a snorty beast of horsepower at the best of times. But on this occasion, I had a couple of workmates keen to come out to experience a clubsport event, so I entered purely to take them out for skids.

I always forget that while I'm really used to the motor racing experience, and the "power" that the Corolla has (all both kilowatts!) that I'm a bit blasé about it. So I had been warning them not to expect a super scary ride or anything, as it is a largely stock Corolla, just with safety gear in it and some sticky tyres.

It was a great day for it though, with decent weather, other than the inevitable strong breeze that comes with being near the sea anywhere near Wellington ...

There was a field of just over 50 cars entered, so that meant about a 90 minute gap between runs more or less. Andrew and I had snaffled a BBQ, in anticipation of quite a bit of sitting around, so once lunchtime rolled around, that paid off nicely and a lot of burger and bacon were then

consumed! Always seems to be a theme in our motorsport, we spent almost as much time thinking about the catering as we do the racing!

Prior to Port Road, I'd got the springs swapped over, removing the Tein springs (which I had long suspected were too soft) and fitting the very old King springs that I'd had in the car for about the first 8 years of its life. The added benefit of the Kings is that the car is a bit higher, which means less of a fight to get the trolley jack under the front, and also less of a tendency of the car to drag the exhaust on the ground all the way around Kapiti autocross track (very low springs in the rear!).

The new (old) spring set up definitely paid off, with much less diagonal weight transfer around the corners at Port Road, and the inside front wheel only getting half a foot off the ground rather than nearer a complete foot off the ground!

The Corolla was booked in for a bit of a mechanical birthday after Port Road, so I have to admit that I was being a bit harder on the old girl than I normally am when taking off, and I think I accidentally found a good way to get off the line at long last. I'd normally launched her at about 4500 which resulted in a bit of a bog down before getting away, but at Port Road I was using 5000 or more at launch (mostly just to make things interesting for my passengers), and that meant a decent cloud of tyre smoke (as far as you ever get from a stock 4AGE), but it meant that I would wheelspin through to about 7000rpm before the car eventually caught up to the tyres, I'd get another 800rpm in first and then hook second. Warmed up the tyres a bit, and meant no bogging down.

My workmates enjoyed their runs in the Corolla, with both of them being a bit surprised that a standard 1600cc Corolla went like that, and generally enjoyed themselves. There's a couple of good photos of my workmate who is also my flatmate grinning like a lunatic all the way through the runs she did in the silly seat.

So I'm pretty sure I've recruited a couple of people who might come out for a play again at some stage ... always good to remind yourself, that the sport we play in is actually quite new and exciting for most people to experience!

I think I was about 9th out of 12 in the 1600cc class. Not helped a lot because on my last run of the day (which was the only run I did solo) I completely overcooked the Barnes Street barrel corner on the first lap, and ended up going down the road completely sideways a few different times until I eventually caught it!

It's always a good day out at Port Road when the weather is good, and despite the big field, HVMC got through it fairly smoothly, even with the inevitable coming and going of cars to the businesses within the road closure area.

But without keeping those businesses on side, we'd not be able to get the venue! So it's a small price to pay really, when you look at how many other venues have been lost just due to a tiny amount of "difficult" locals digging their toes in.

Apparently Barton's Line is now a no-go venue because of that, although to be fair I've not actually heard that directly, but rather through the rumour mill.

On the Monday of Labour weekend was the second half of the all tarmac HVMC weekend (no triathlon this year unfortunately, due to lack of manpower available). I was once again running the Corolla, although I did think rather seriously about entering the WRX just to see what would happen

They ran basically the exact same course as last event, which was quite a good layout, with some decent weight transition decisions to make as you got down to the far end of the course. The last time I did that course was in Richard's "Practically a Lotus", where I had all of the power to weight ratio (near twice that of my Corolla) but none of the turning circle. So the poor old Corolla was feeling positively glacial off the line and down the straights, but was hugely quicker around the hairpin turns.

I think I got myself up into the top 16, but was *miles* away from getting into the top 8! Definitely need with some power, or a very dedicated tarmac set up to get much further up the field there. With the Sti pilots being able to do the mad power launches off the line once, and at three barrel turn arounds, it's a bit much of an ask for my little car to keep up with them!

Then after that event, the Corolla has had a bit of a birthday. After having had the engine in there since May 2006 (and it was an unknown engine straight from a wrecker) I thought it was time to actually pull the bottom end bearings and check the state of them, as I'd been getting the odd bit of gold flake appearing with oil changes.

So it turns out that after seven and a half years of competition use, the crank bearings were wearing a little bit, and the big end bearings were getting a bit worn (big ends being the Achilles heel of the 4AGE engines). The crank didn't need anything doing to it, so it was a case of bearings done with the engine otherwise intact. The same clutch (7.5 years old, factory Toyota part) went back in again, as it's only half worn.

Definitely can't complain about how tough Toyota builds some of their parts ... just don't mention their rust proofing techniques.

I replaced the gearbox, going from the C52 with the viscous diff that had been in there untouched for ten years, with a C56 (slightly better second to third ratio) fitted with a plate diff courtesy of the rolled ex-Victor into the water Corolla. It must be said that the ten year old gearbox I took out is in better general condition than the gearbox I've put in ... but the nicer C56 ratio's and plate diff (clonk clonk clonk!) should offset the slightly more worn synchro and slightly whiny diff.

While everything else was being done, John Raptis (free plug for John as a mechanic) reconstructed the TOMS airbox that I purchased, but seemed to have some sort of manufacturing issue just didn't come close to sealing up. So that's unlocked a little bit more power in the old girl. Longer term, I've decided that I'm going to put the Corolla into gravel spec, as I figure that the lesser power output on gravel is going to be less frustrating on a loose surface than it is on tarmac, as I'm a bit over being an "also ran" at every single tarmac event except for Kaihinau Road! So, might be time to have a bit of a learn of a new thing, and see how the old girl goes on gravel.

Having had the car for the majority of the last ten years, there's a distinct sentimental attachment to the car, so it's either turn it into a gravel car, or actually convert it back to a road car again! So if anyone has built an AE92 gravel car that doesn't constantly drag the floorpan on the ground, I'd be

interested to see how you did it!

Talking of gravel, bear in mind that Kapiti has gone to pre-entry for their Otaihanga Autocross events, because they need to ensure they exceed break-even numbers, and they've not done so in a while.

Clubnight is going to be dinner and a movie, with Dave brining along the Delorean Story for us to watch.

December 14 and 15 we're running a double header Tauherenikau event (Featherston). 14th will be a Motorkhana in the afternoon \$20 15th will be an autocross for \$30

Accommodation on site is super cheap and basic if you decide you want to stay. I recall it's under \$20.

So I really hope we'll see a lot of you there (cos we could really use some good numbers to boost the coffers, since we've had yet another year of being unable to run any speed events!!!).

That's it from me for now – Merry Christmas folks!

At the last WMSA meeting it was decided that for 2014 points awarded to ALL championships will be changed.

This is for two reasons:

- 1 So that points are aimed at PERFORMANCE rather than PARTICIPATION
- 2 To simplify points keeping, thus reducing the potential for errors.

To this end points will be awarded on the following scale for ALL championships:

Two other changes are to be made:

1 Sealed Sprints will now have a separate class for 4WD (they were previously included in the Over2000 class) -this brings them into line with the classes in the Regs.

2 A new Trophy; the Ron Scanlon Memorial trophy will awarded to drivers competing in the Duncan Mackenzie series in normally aspirated 2WD vehicles of 1600cc or less. Point to be awarded to the first 5 place getters.


Sunday – Autocross

Cost \$30 per person Helmets and overalls are required today. BBQ will be running on Sunday for the usual donations system so bring some coins.


Accommodation

They refused and instead asked that he come out to the parking lot to their car.

The old man got very excited and invited them back to the office, where he offered them \$3 million for the patent.

The brothers refused, saying they would settle for \$2 million, but they wanted the recognition by having a label, 'The Goldberg Air-Conditioner,' on the dashboard of each car in which it was installed.

Now old man Ford was more than just a little anti-Semitic, and there was no way he was going to put the Goldberg's name on two million Fords.

They haggled back and forth for about two hours and finally agreed on \$4 million and that just their first names would be shown.

And so to this day, all Ford air conditioners show -- Lo, Norm, Hi, and Max -- on the controls.




