A very quiet month for me, having only done Rally Wairarapa, so therefore an equally short article (sorry Len!), as my other planned event for the month was the Kapiti Autocross which got cancelled.

Rally Wairarapa was again excellent, although the course was somewhat altered from the initial intended plan of attack, due to lambing effecting road closures. Despite that they ended up with a good layout, without too much in the way of long tour distances. We covered quite a few k's in the morning, with a decent sort of commute to the first loop, then back to Eketahuna service. That said, I think in the past when we've been in Pongaroa, the commute there is quite a bit worse. I seem to recall one straight bit of road that I struggle to stay awake on every single time we cruise through it.

Brian's car hasn't really needed a lot doing to it recently, which is a good sign. There were a few hiccups over winter related to some corrosion getting in behind the fuse box, which resulted in a few "no volts" issues. But that seems to have been resolved with parts supplied by Andrew Thomson, and some labour by Nick T. Nothing like having useful car contacts through the car club! Having also been running the car a few years on gravel, Brian has now invested in some under body plastics to save the floor pan being gradually worn away in increments.

There is a persistent minor oil leak from the distributor, that drops oil onto the exhaust manifold, but that's pretty much an occupational hazard of the 4AGE engine, and the sump isn't perfectly sealed. However considering that the Corolla is showing well North of 200,000km on the clock, and has been a caged car for about the last ten years, it is doing pretty well.

I had a nice drive over the Rimutaka's in the slow little Corolla road car, although it still surprises me how capable that car actually is. Having been my daily driver for over 18 months, and typically getting me 16km/I on mixed driving ... whilst apparently not really wearing anything out, other than brake pads. Though I do feel that they're dumbing down the Rimutaka's a bit much now, for those of us who actually like corners.

Brian, Webster, and I solved the problems of the world (or at least, the motoring and sporting worlds) on Friday night, in anticipation of a relatively gentle start time on Saturday morning.

It was a really nice day, and fortunately not quite as warm as it had been threatening to be (23 degrees combined with two layer flame resistant overalls sounds like a sweaty combination). We

were actually doing lots of the touring stages with the windows down, and we started one stage with a window open accidentally too (which went badly due to the resulting dust storm!).

We had a generally very low drama day, putting petrol in the car, and no other work required. Which is pretty much the ideal day out in a rally car.

Others were definitely not so lucky, Viv and Steve had exhaust leak issues, drove off the road, and then to add insult to injury, while coming back onto the road, managed to do so at the same time Jeff Ward arrived on the scene, and they had a decent attempt at making a hybrid Sti and BMW combo. Luckily no major issues arose from that. Coincidentally just after that, Jeff's leaking diff ran out of oil, locked up, and rotated him gently into the scenery.

John Raptis, Andrew Thomson, and Webster joined Jeff's service crew, and managed to replace from what I can tell, was basically the entire rear axle assembly, and get the BMW out there racing again.

A number of cars suffered inversions or diversions into the green bits during the day. We passed Paul De Rose upside down, and extremely in the middle of the road. Browne we passed not once, but twice in his Integra (previously he'd run an AE82 Corolla liftback) parked a surprising distance from the road. There was a spectacularly rolled and bowled WRX, luckily though with good safety gear, both driver and navigator were unharmed. Their bank balances were fairly harmed however.

As always, I've no clue at all who actually won the rally, but we were safely in last place (despite Viv's efforts at repeatedly parking the car off the road to let us catch up). Another excellent day out in the Corolla though, didn't drive into anything, nothing important broke, and it was a good day to be cruising around the countryside.

About the Kapti car club autocross, they've reached the point where there simply aren't enough entries to justify running the day, so for the next autocross, they are going to do pre-entry, and only run the event if they can get a dozen people committed. So, this is your early warning, you're going to see notifications for their December event ... don't just file the email away, if you're going to be there you absolute MUST send away something to tell them that you're going to attend. Without your support, we will lose this venue, and it will be a huge shame, as it is one of the best ways to get started on gravel events.

Talking of venues, I'm told that the noise plan is signed off which should allow us to start running autocross events at Slipway. I'm chasing the landowner to see when we can start booking events.

Note though, that the noise control plan specifies that no drifting can be done at the venue, and we're going to be policed and measured for noise. Bear in mind that if your car is noisy, and you ping the levels on the day, it is almost inevitable that we will have to stop you running on the day and send you home. So, do something about the car well in advance ... put in another muffler, or run the car with a bolt in silencer if you think that's going to get you down to well UNDER the allowed noise level by Motorsport NZ. So expect that the supplementary regulations of the event will feature extra noise limits, that will almost certainly be lower than those allowed by MSNZ.

Long term for the farm, they'd look at building a larger complex further away from their "difficult" neighbours, which would allow them to run drifting again, and of course offer a more interesting and larger area in which we can run events. For that plan to work, we the local motorsport clubs are likely to need to put in input, and get involved too. So bear that in mind for the long term, or if you're contemplating doing any work on your exhaust. There's a few really loud vtec Honda's around that there's probably no point even attempting to run if we've got a noise limit to work with.





A message from Dave follows:


All competitors checked in eventually. The Stockbridge's arrived very late, but with a clean sheet, bumping John Rapley and AJ Martin back to 5th.
