Article September

The drought has at last broken, the Corolla has been out of the garage twice, in anger. Well, once in fun, and once in some degree of frustration!

The long awaited first event for the Corolla since November last year (wince) was Mangahao Dam, which is my favourite bit of gravel thus far (I don't claim to have had all that much range of gravel experience though).

The wake up call was positively offensively early in the morning. I can't recall exactly how early, as I have tried to blank it from my mind. I think about the only good thing was, my neighbour was away, meaning the car stayed in the garage the night before, so I didn't have to defog it for ten minutes before starting the drive Northward.

It was pretty bloody cold in the pits, which is about standard there, as it doesn't get any direct sun for a while. An unwelcome addition to the car park was a sodding big container, probably there for completely valid reasons, but most definitely made life difficult in the car park for us.

We were warned at driver's briefing that the road had suffered quite badly due to the amount of rain that had been inflicting the world in general for some time prior to the event. They were assuredly not kidding.

Mark Rutherford was there for the first time, so he came up the hill with me. Luckily his helmet isn't compatible with my intercom, or there may have been quite a few uses of colourful language during the process of getting to the top of the hill.

Even the one straight bit over the rocks, past a marshal point was so badly carved that I actually was zig zagging my way through it, to try to find a non destructive line.

It was a really frustrating practice run, and I decided that given the condition of the road, and my lack of interest in rebuilding my suspension, I was going to put in one official timed run, then pack it in.

The first timed run showed that the road was continuing to fall to bits, and we got launched off the ground fairly nicely on a few occasions just through ruts. So that was me for the day. Didn't even bother putting the good tyres on the front, got a lousy result, and not much driving. About the only positive I can come up with, is that I drove the car there, and was able to drive it home again. So that was my "frustration" day.

Thank goodness though, the Neil's Wheels Rubber Duck autocross was a blast! So that made up for only doing 50% of the miles at Shannon.

We had a whopper of an entry, ending up with 48 drivers, in the usual highly eclectic collection of vehicles. We had Tallguy racing in the Falcon, Tim Box running some sort of soccer mum diesel SUV thing (Ford Kuga, if you're being specific), Ian in the Escudo (after the intended race Peugeot diesel stationwagon dropped a large quantity of fluid on the trailer) tow vehicle, and basically half a paddock worth of Corolla variations.

Two of my ex cars were there, with the Albaru DeTomato, and the PC Toyota Schitz. So that was a bit of a laugh.

Mark, Geoff and I wandered about the paddock, being chased by Adam towing a trailer full of cones. We zig zagged between the gnarly bits as best we could, and set out a fairly flowing course, just in case the ground had taken enough of a soaking that we dug out corners. Once again, I forgot my gumboots ... whoops. Race boots are basically a sponge, with laces.

We had LOADS of juniors running, which was utterly brilliant to see. To try to ease them into the skids on grass experience, we put on some more intro laps for them, and allowed the "dad in passenger seat" option where they wanted it.

You'll certainly recognise the Junior's surnames ... Seabright, Jopson, Mason (x2). Along with a duo of Carvers. Seems to be the season for the next generation to hit the sort of age where they can come out for a play.

There was a damn fine demonstration of the apple not falling far from the tree with the Mason twins (in identical, but different Corollas). That was battle royal from start to finish, with some completely sideways handbrake antics from start to finish too (clearly it's genetic). Exactly how much were they twinning? Well over two courses, the gap between them was 0.3 of a second. Though to give you an idea of how competitive that end of the field was, there were actually two other drivers sitting in between the twins in the results.

Vinnie and Annabelle Carver both put in a good solid drive all day. They just kept getting quicker and quicker each run, as the confidence grew. A couple of cones were mowed down in the process, but that's exactly what this sort of event is for. Gain some practice, run into some very low consequence objects.

Ethan was having a good day of it in the Honda. Though dad "helped" during one of the tiki tour runs with some handbrake application, causing dad to then have to go back and put a cone back up again. To be fair, this is exactly how you'd expect Steve to go ... he threatened to come back at some stage with the Escort, so that could be a giggle.

Ryan and Jody Seabright were competing in a recently purchased KP Starlet rally car. I don't know the details of the car, but it certainly looks fairly serious, and

sounded like some brutal clutch and diff noises when it was departing the line. Haven't seen Jody behind the wheel since Slipway days in his Mirage road car. But he doesn't appear to have lost any fire.

Along with the gang of juniors, Brent and Paula Reddington came down from Hawkes Bay, bringing an accumulation of speedway drivers with them! So we've probably never had such a good collection of out of towners running.

Unfortunately for Andrew and Kaila, their BMW did BMW things, choosing to evacuate the cooling system. Luckily for them, it was a trailered club car anyway, and they jumped cars into some Corolla's and carried right on racing.

Despite the BMW antics, I think Michael in the Familia gets the hard luck award for the day, as he backed into a post in the car park. On the positive side, the post was extremely rotten, so it just fell over, rather than causing too much damage. On the negative side, I guess there's going to be a repair bill for a new post!

We had two runs at the first course, then three at the second course. Although as the temperature dropped away in the afternoon, the times actually got slower. So possibly not a lot of point (other than random skids) in running that late in the day, during winter anyway.

The second course was a bit quicker, with some long sections where you could walk the car around on the throttle quite well, if you were so inclined. Though there were also some bits that playing too much with the throttle might lead you into some unintended corner entry speed and angles. So that was fun.

The pointy end of the field (as compared to the posty end of the field, sorry Michael) was pretty intense for competition. Neil and Al ending up in a dead heat in the first course, followed not very closely by Adam and myself.

Over in the rear skidders part of the paddock, Dean and Keith were swapping times all day in their respective MX5's. Though using very different methods. The Herd MX5 is stock height (about 20 feet off the ground), and about 5psi tyre pressure. Meantime Keith was running semi slicks on the back of his (because more tread than his road tyres), and is in a lowered car. Though we were all wincing at some of the bash and crash noises emerging from Keith's car. Brendon Norling was trying to keep up with them, putting in a tidy drive in the Altezza. But it's a big car by comparison, and power definitely was not helping on the day, but he kept it clear of the John in the AE86, and came home third in class.

Four wheel drive was a bit less of a close fight, with Geoff running away with it, but with Brendon and Andrew running pretty much the same times as each other (and in the same car). You knew when Brendon was driving, as you could hear the limiter bashing from all over the paddock. Michael and Ian (Familia and Escudo respectively) were having a good fight for fourth position too.

At the end of the day, the top 10 was: Neil, Al, Adam, me, Brent (all in EOD), Dean, Keith (both in ENOD), Geoff (first of the 4wd cars), Mark, and then Webster.

So it was the front drivers, followed by a pair of MX5's in a surprisingly high overall position. The greasy surface really meant that the four wheel drives were struggling to turn. We didn't really dry out the paddock, or dig any holes. So we knocked the grass off, and then basically just slid around on the top layer of dirt all day. As always, heaps of people stepped up and helped during the day, with cones, timing, cooking, wrangling the line. Without you guys helping us out like that, we'd probably

be lucky to get half the numbers of runs done that we did. So thanks to all the people from all the different clubs, for making it an excellent day out. It's a bloody good little community we have going.

Thanks go of course to Neil's Wheels, our naming sponsor, and supplier of all those nice cold drinks during the day, Wairarapa Car Club for the use of their paddock and rooms, and Nationwide Fire Protection (Jeff Ward) who has supplied the extinguishers that we sincerely hope to never have to use.

Our next round (weather willing) is SATURDAY (he shouted) September 19th. Also if you're interested in making a weekend of it, Wairarapa is running a sealed bent sprint using we believe the drag strip, and some return road. Though I don't know their exact layout intention.

Third round, we're still awaiting date confirmation.

Motorsport NZ AGCM was a Zoom conference thanks to Covid levels, and was a little bit frustrating, because half the point of the day is the networking. However, them's the rules, and I'd have been quite reluctant to attend a big conference in person these days.
