Presidential Prattling

Quiet January, followed a frantic December.

December was a lot of fun, keeping me out of the house, and keeping the bank balance nice and tragic. Even with a couple of events not happening (Rally Waitomo and Upper Hutt Street Sprint both being unable to run due to, if I understand correctly, road closure / council issues).

The Corolla had the cobwebs blown off, after quite a long hiatus, with a duet of gravel sprints to end the year.

Levin Car Club ran a new road, Woolshed Road, up in the forest South of Totara Park deeper into the forestry, past the roads previously being used in there. Actually, I drove up one of the old sprint roads, in the process of driving perhaps 9km into the forestry to get to the pits.

It was a bit of a different layout, with the pits being in a big flat area, relatively close to the finish line, and around a seven-minute drive away from the start line. The drive from the pits to the start line was actually as sketchy as heck, with massive ruts, big rocks, and quite a savage downhill slope. I followed Mark down to the start before one run, with the camera running, just to see how far one of his wheels was coming off the ground, given that the Corolla felt like it was a foot off the ground at that point.

The weather on the day was pretty damn ordinary, starting out with cloud, and finishing up with rain. All the in between stages that you'd expect to see on a day like that.

It was fun, if challenging to be on a brand- new bit of road, as none of us knew what to expect anywhere on it. It was a road of two halves, with the first half being savagely steep, then going in to a run along the ridge. Both parts of the road are very wiggly, with basically the only decent length of straight being the finish line straight. Tiki Tour and Practice I had Len Fisher in the silly seat, as he was writing notes for the benefit of Team K Series (Adam Fisher and Marty B in their KP Starlets).

The Corolla was definitely struggling with the hill, and for much of it, I really needed gear 2.5. I made it up to third gear on the climb at one point, but it wasn't liking it. So, I ended up just sitting the poor little thing on, or near to the rev cut in second gear. Which sounded fast, but really wasn't. Along the ridge line, it was a bit of third, but mostly second due to corners that were tight enough to seriously get your attention. I did attempt a bit more third, but that resulted in a bit much looking out the side window around the corner, without enough revs to drag it straight again.

I gradually built up some speed from practice, to the first two timed runs. Then it pissed down for the third and final run, so I backed right out of and went slower. But I had a good old slide going almost immediately on the wet run, and elected to back right out of it, rather than take any risks. Although on one of the runs, Mark decided to make my life exciting, as he did a slight offroad excursion, and dragged a rock the size of a crash helmet (maybe?) onto the road. That resulted in a certain amount of swears and dodging, as I concluded that hitting the rock would cause Very Bad Things to occur.

Talking of Very Bad Things, Brendon Cantwell had the misfortune to seriously bin the Starlet (Evo powered) during practice. Both occupants are fine, but the bodywork and roll cage have suffered quite a bit of damage. If the car is to be repaired (which seems possible) it is going to need a new front half of the cage, and most of the panels.

Ben Watson (of Slipway) absolutely slaughtered everyone on his first timed run, by a margin I can only describe as being embarrassing, but then killed something in the drivetrain on the launch of timed run two, limping through the course with not many driven wheels on the GT4.

Mark finished third in Class A, behind a couple of loonies (Dayle in the Barina, and then Marty B in the Starlet).

Class B saw Adam in the Starlet, followed by Clint in the 4AGE Starlet, Brent Miller, then Rob Piper and myself in a dead heat, Neil Tapp making a long overdue return in the FXGT, Paul Tapper, Toby, Ross, and then Jilly (also driving the Starlet). So quite a few HCCC drivers in that class.

Graham came in fourth in the big boy 2wd class, with Peter Langdon taking out first in the KE V8 Corolla.

Fun road, do recommend, hearty two thumbs up from me.

Before I did the new road, there was first a very familiar road, with Wairarapa's Dorsets Road. We were running a split field, with a no contact zone in the pits between Group 1 and Group 2, which was a bit different, but was how Wairarapa decided to manage Covid requirements such that they were able to run the event.

From my point of view, the weather was pretty good. While it was blue and sunny, there was a decent cool breeze. This meant that I didn't cook my brain cells (the few remaining cells anyway), and also meant that the dust was being cleared pretty well between cars. That said, I was running the air con quite a bit, just to keep it all civilised in the car, especially for the group runs back down the hill.

I figure I've spent enough to get the air con back into the car, so I'm going to use it at the drop of a hat. Exceedingly vague memory suggests to me that I might even have been running the air on the way home due to it raining, and the car fogging up.

I was gradually building up speed during the day, while also trying to remember how gravel and front drive worked. Possibly the highlight of the day (other than not crashing of course) was the burger from the food truck that was there on the day. Highly recommended.

Mostly I concentrated on trying to be smooth around the corners, without getting too sideways anywhere. As the road is pretty steep, and I'm not blessed with a lot of power, pretty much every event I do in the Corolla is 90% momentum, and 10% nervous sweating.

Gradually got faster, to end up fourth in class. Class B was a massacre at the front of the group, with Yeti cleaning us all up, followed by Clint Clunie, who has purchased a pretty radical KP Starlet. Then third to fifth was Brent Miller, myself, Toby Miller, on a 32.0, 32.1 then 32.3. Can't really get a lot closer than that.

Other HCCC pilots were Greg in the KP coming in third in Class A. Jeremy and Paul Tapper in B in 7th & 10. Paul Stent winning Class C in the BMW (Dunlop tyres eh Paul?). Graham taking second in D. Albaru and Dick running in 6 and 7 in class Jeep.

Lucky last event for 2021 was the third and final of our James Bond autocross trilogy, brought to you by Neil's Wheels, and Nationwide Fire Protection.

This time, there wasn't lock shenanigans, so we could get into the paddock straight away, and I could start setting up the course. We got underway with a pretty decent turnout of 37 starters, which isn't shabby for an event that close to Christmas.

We even had a few out-of-town guests, with Brent & Julie Reddington, and Donna Elder all down from Hawkes Vegas. Pretty decent length of a tow down the island for them, so it is always good to see people putting in that sort of effort for our skids in a paddock day. Clan Reddington was running the AE92 Corolla, and Donna was in a pretty snorty KP Starlet running a 4AGE + turbo.

Having gotten into the event a bit quicker this round, we were able to give everyone who wanted to, three runs at each course.

Despite all the rain in the week leading up to the Sunday, it was rock hard underfoot, and rapidly got dusty. In the morning, at least the wind was going in the right direction so that we weren't just eating it. In the afternoon, well, at least we were hiding out in an air-conditioned vehicle (thanks Webster!), so that stayed pretty comfortable despite the dust eating.

While I was setting out course two, the Altezza spat the alternator belt out in several bits. That wasn't ideal. Thankfully Dean jumped in, and did a new belt on the car while we started the afternoon course. Many thanks to Dean, otherwise that would have ended my day. Must be something about course setting, as it was during course setting that the brakes went out to lunch on that car earlier in the year.

But the Altezza lived another day, my first course times were a bit average, but I went a decent bit quicker during the second course. Once it got home, it did get a new accessory belt to go with the new alternator belt, and new engine mounts too. Seems like the Altezza has enjoyed a minimal to zero maintenance regime from the previous long-term owner. Probably by the time I get bored and sell the car, I will have all the worn-out parts replaced (not unlike the Corolla 2 Super Windy).

In the four-wheeler peeler class, we had Graham, Al, then Geoff. Drifter skids was Lee, me, Brendon. Bum draggers class was Adam, PC, then Neil. Angry bees were Matty followed by Jared (both driving Matty's Cross Car).

Overall, for the series, taking home the rubber ducks were (in the same class order as above), Graham, Lee, Adam, Matty.

We have changed the points system from this trilogy a little bit from previous years, to give the first three placegetters in class a bit more of an incentive. So, if you've seen the points, you'll see that we ended up with a few more points between each place on the podium (despite it being a very tight battle before this round).

Thanks as always to everyone who helped out officially on the day, Adam, Jilly, Al, Neil, Webster, Sarah, and everyone else who helped us out with cones, timing, and food. It's only because of you guys & girls jumping in, that we're able to run such a full-on day, with a small crew. Neil's Wheels and Nationwide Fire Protection (Jeff Ward) continue to be our sponsors, for which we are very grateful.

I'll wrap it up here, and cover off the Levin Motorkhana next month.




