We're going to do the double-event weekend for that, so Saturday 17th will be a motorkhana in the afternoon. After which, we will adjourn to Neil & Lynda's house in Carterton for some light refreshments. Then,on the Sunday there will be a KN round Rubber Duck Autocross.
