Presidential Prattling

Pretty good end to 2022, with two from the intended three events happening.

Levin Car Club had a new gravel road that the council was keen for them to try out, so that happened in December at fairly short notice. It was described as a short-sharp sprint, and it lived up to the name!

Really little bit of road, I think the competition distance was 1.2 km or so, with just barely enough room between the finish of the sprint, and the junction with the main road to squeeze in a dozen cars (so long as we squeezed and stacked anyway).

It was quite heavily gravelled, so was pretty slippery, and remained very deep offline. The finish line was on quite a challenging sort of a corner, so I kept frightening the cone by the finish line.

As is my tendency at my first couple of times at an unfamiliar venue, I spent the entire day being unsure at what was going to happen around every corner, which didn't serve me very well, but did mean that I didn't throw the Corolla at the scenery. So I'll take that as being an acceptable outcome.

With the tall first gear, I definitely appreciated that this event had a downhill start! There were three official runs, and then for those who were keen, another two unofficial runs. Pleasingly I picked up lots of time in the unofficials, and managed to miss the finish line cone, despite my best efforts. Then when I reached the end of the day, and I came to put air in the tyres again for the drive home, it would appear that I was running far too high a psi. I'm not entirely sure why,

possibly related to a \$10 Repco tyre pressure gauge... luckily I have another three or four of them, so I can just chuck this one in the bin if I need to.

I've had another muffler chucked on the back of the Corolla instead of the high performance one, as the volume out the back of the car is fair doing my head in. The noise is reduced considerably, however I think it's still maybe a fraction still too loud (given that with the changed gearbox, my 100 kph cruising RPM is now 4000 rpm).

Although this week NZTA announced they're dropping the speed limit between Featherston and Masterton, so I will be able to drop the noise down for that section of road.

Oh, and courtesy of Ross McKenzie I replaced the top hats on the Corolla front struts, having mentioned that I punched through the top hat at Dorsets, in my last article. So thanks for that Ross, much appreciated! This was done before the Levin sprint, just in case you thought I was enough of an animal to do an event with a knackered strut.

Then we had another dose of the Masterton weather curse. Because, of course we did.

It was the double header weekend with the Motorkhana Saturday afternoon, and the Autocross on Sunday.

Saturday was on and off rain, showers, then misty rain throughout the afternoon.

We did three tests on the drag strip seal, as best we could given that the drag strip is pretty narrow, and then three tests on the wet grass.

I dragged the newly purchased tiny appliance car (Kia Picanto) over to the motorkhana so that I could actually enter, and had a fun little fang around. She's only a very small car, which is good, but has a disc brake rear end, which is less good for handbrake antics.

Even a car the size of a shoebox was struggling a bit on the narrow track, so there were a few attempts at setting courses before finding ones that were possible to achieve, without just being a slalom or ever increasing/decreasing circles (aka: the most boring motorkhana test ever).

To be democratic, I threw it over to the competitors if they wanted to stay on tarmac or split the tests to do the second half on grass. Only one driver wanted to stay on tarmac, with the rest being keen to go get coated in mangled greenery.

I ended up with the usual dose of diced grass distributed over every surface of the car, even including between the undertray and bumper.

The Picanto is pretty hilariously slow on the road. It was okay over the Remutaka range, although I tried twice and failed twice to overtake a slow car up the hill. Turns out my slow car was just as slow as their slow car. In the end, they actually pulled out of the way so I could get past them. Possibly because it was just too embarrassing to keep seeing a tiny car attempt to get past, and then end up at the end of the overtaking lane, exactly the same distance behind them as it was at the start of the overtaking lane. The steep sections of hill on TG heading South have to be tackled by holding a steady 100 kph by using 5000 rpm in third gear. To make matters worse, it's not even as economical as you'd think, given the lack of power. It's still good for 16 and a bit km per litre, but to be honest I was hoping for 20, given that she's only 1100 cc of fury.

On the positive side though, she's only got 36 km on the clock, has an acceptable stereo, and has

properly freezing cold air con. Plus very importantly, it's not drinking diesel and demanding RUC's, unlike the Sorento.

Then while we were up at the motorkhana on the Saturday, the weather insisted on precipitating, so we had to pull the plug on the Sunday autocross, or we would just have knocked all the grass off the ground, and basically been at a standstill all day. But at least we had an excellent dinner at Neil and Lynda's on the Saturday night after the motorkhana.

Then January rolled around again, and a cyclone weather system turned up at the same time as our next scheduled event... so that was rained off too. I believe we're up to six rained off autocross events in a row. Which is just crazy, as it means the only autocross in this area that ran during 2022 was the January 2022 Women in Motorsport Autocross. So there will be no Kim Naylor autocross trophy being awarded for the year gone. Very disappointing!

I would say "hey but we have another two scheduled, on February and March 5th".. but I'm not going to say that, because apparently that offends some sort of rain god, and we'd just get rained off again and again.

I'm writing this just before Wellington Anniversary weekend, and a few of us are heading up to Manfeild for the weekend to do their Multi Event Weekend. That comprises of a grass motorkhana and autocross on Saturday, followed by a sealed full track (reverse direction) autocross, and then a three lap track sprint (3 km normal direction).

Should be a good weekend, and will be my first outing in the GR Yaris, which ought to be entertaining.

As well as the theoretically possible February and March autocross events (go away rain), we also have AGM at Club night in Feb. Hope to see some of you there.

That's it from me for now.
